The Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross is a devotional consisting of prayers and meditations before each of the fourteen crosses or images commemorating the events of the Passion of Jesus. It is a private devotion celebrated publically on each of the Fridays during Lent. A priest does not have to preside over the Stations; it is often led by a Deacon, Nun or lay person. The images include the following and conclude with a reflection on the Resurrection.

1. Jesus is condemned to death
2. Jesus receives the cross
3. Jesus falls the first time
4. Jesus meets His Mother
5. Simon of Cyrene carries the cross
6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
7. Jesus falls the second time
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
9. Jesus falls the third time
10. Jesus is stripped of His garments
11. Crucifixion: Jesus is nailed to the cross
12. Jesus dies on the cross
13. Jesus' body is removed from the cross (Pieta)
14. Jesus is laid in the tomb and covered in incense

St. Jude offers both the traditional and contemporary forms of the Stations; alternating weekly. The traditional devotional is pre-Vatican II and focuses on the sufferings of Mary. The contemporary form challenges us to focus on how we live the scripture. Please join us on Friday evenings at 6:30PM to experience the Stations of the Cross in English, 7:30PM in Spanish or 8:30PM in Portuguese.

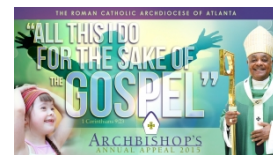
Electronic Giving

Lenten Regulations

Fasting and Abstinence

Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be used at all. Regarding other weekdays of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended.

Penance During Lent

The season of Lent is a penitential time and should be marked by some form of self-denial. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

Anointing of the Sick

Monday, March 2

The Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are ill or suffering. By the sacred anointing and the prayer of the priest, the whole Church commends those who are sick to Christ. The sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gifts of strength, faith, peace and courage, and his or her suffering is united with the suffering of Christ for the building up of the Church (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) nos.1520-23). The Sacrament is administered on the first Monday of the month immediately after the 6:00PM Mass or, by appointment with a priest at any time. All who are sick or suffering are invited to receive anointing.

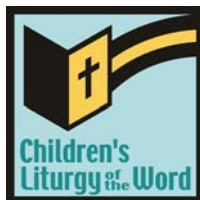

“Desejo que conheças mais a fundo o Meu amor de que está inflamado o Meu Coração pelas almas, e compreenderás isso quando refletires sobre a Minha Paixão. (Diário de Santa Faustina #186) Iniciamos no dia 20 de fevereiro, às 8:15PM - na igreja. Em inglês às 6:30PM e em espanhol às 7:30PM.



O Jejum Deve ser Acompanhado de Mudança de Vida

O jejum nos ajuda a aprender a renunciar a alguma coisa. Ele nos faz capazes de dizer “não” a nós mesmos, e nos abre aos valores mais nobres de nossa alma: a



espiritualidade, a reflexão, a vontade consciente. Essa prática nos coloca de pé e de cabeça para cima. Há muitos que caminham de cabeça para baixo; isso acontece quando o corpo

comanda o espírito e o esmaga. É o prazer do corpo que o comanda e não a vontade do espírito. É preciso entender que a renúncia às sensações, aos estímulos, aos prazeres e ainda ao alimento ou às bebidas, não é um fim em si mesmo, mas apenas um “meio” que deve apenas preparar o caminho para conquistas mais profundas. A renúncia do alimento deve servir para criar em nós condições para podermos viver os valores superiores.

«Se um Membro Sofre, Com ele Sofrem Todos os Membros» (1 Cor 12, 26): A Igreja.

“Com o seu ensinamento e sobretudo com o seu testemunho, a Igreja oferece-nos o amor de Deus, que rompe esta reclusão mortal em nós mesmos que é a indiferença. Mas, só se pode testemunhar algo que antes experimentámos. O cristão é aquele que permite a Deus revesti-lo da sua bondade e misericórdia, revesti-lo de Cristo para se tornar, como Ele, servo de Deus e dos homens. Bem no-lo recorda a liturgia de Quinta-feira Santa com o rito do lava-pés. Pedro não queria que Jesus lhe lavasse os pés, mas depois compreendeu que Jesus não pretendia apenas exemplificar como devemos lavar os pés uns aos outros; este serviço, só o pode fazer quem, primeiro, se deixou lavar os pés por Cristo. Só essa pessoa «tem a haver com Ele» (cf. Jo 13, 8), podendo assim servir o homem.

A Quaresma é um tempo propício para nos deixarmos servir por Cristo e, deste modo, tornarmo-nos como Ele. Verifica-se isto quando ouvimos a Palavra de Deus e recebemos os sacramentos, nomeadamente a Eucaristia. Nesta, tornamo-nos naquilo que recebemos: o corpo de Cristo. Neste corpo, não encontra lugar a tal indiferença que, com tanta frequência, parece apoderar-se dos nossos corações; porque, quem é de Cristo, pertence a um único corpo e, n’Ele, um não olha com indiferença o outro.

«Assim, se um membro sofre, com ele sofrem todos os membros; se um membro é honrado, todos os membros participam da sua alegria» (1 Cor 12, 26).

A Igreja é *communio sanctorum*, não só porque, nela, tomam parte os Santos mas também porque é comunhão de coisas santas: o amor de Deus, que nos foi revelado em Cristo, e todos os seus dons; e, entre estes, há que incluir também a resposta de quantos se deixam alcançar por tal amor. Nesta comunhão dos Santos e nesta participação nas coisas santas, aquilo que cada um possui, não o reserva só para si, mas tudo é para todos. E, dado que estamos interligados em Deus, podemos fazer algo mesmo pelos que estão longe, por aqueles que não poderíamos jamais, com as nossas simples forças, alcançar: rezamos com eles e por eles a Deus, para que todos nos abramos à sua obra de salvação”.
